In the Spring Term our topic will be 'Animals'. We will learning about the different animal groups. We will be



talking about pets that we have at home. We plan on going to Trent Woods for a trip and to discover some of the animals that they have on the farm.

Green Class

It's hard to believe that we have finished our first term together in Green Class! The children have all been working hard and it has been great to see them progressing with their learning.

Our topic this term has been 'Volcanoes' and we enjoyed making our own volcanoes and then creating eruptions using bicarbonate of soda and vinegar. We read the story 'Escape from Pompeii' and wrote our own



versions of this in English.

In Science, we have learnt about Sound through a range of practical activities. These included making string telephones and panpipes. We also investigated which materials were best for soundproofing. We used the app 'Decibel X' to measure sounds around the school and to identify

the quietest and the noisiest spots!

In addition, we learnt debating skills during Parliament Week. We debated the

question *Should supermarkets only sell healthy food?* We also had a visit from Chris Loder, a prospective candidate for the General Election. On Thursday 12th December, we had a mock election and, by a single vote, this was won by the Labour Party. We have been busy preparing for our

Christmas production entitled 'Santa's on Strike' and we hope you enjoyed our performance.

Our topic next term is Water and we are looking forward to a visit from a Wessex Water employee who will teach us how to clean dirty water!

Orange Class

What a term in Orange Class! In maths we have been busy learning our numbers to 20 and 3D shapes. In English we learnt the story of Monkey sees Monkey does by acting out the story, this culminated in us writing the story ourselves.

We have been busy learning about animals in Science. We were very lucky to have a visit from Longleat. This allowed us to get up close to the animals and learn lots of fun facts about their behaviour. We met snakes, lizards, insects and guinea pigs.

In History we have been learning lots of facts about The Great Fire of London. We have built replica houses, made cakes to an original recipe from 1666 and made our own quills and tried to write with them. Luckily, we did not cause a great fire! We finished our learning by having a visit from a local Fireman who talked to us about fire safety in our homes today. In between all of our learning we have been busy practising our Nativity play and singing all of our songs. We have also made lots of Christmas crafts and fitted in some Christmas baking. Next term will be just as busy. We will start to learn about materials in Science and different cultures around the world in Geography. In Maths we will be learning addition and subtraction and in English we will continue to practise our writing and punctuation by learning a new story. Yellow Class



We have had a busy, enjoyable term. Our topic has been the Stone Age and we had a very successful visit to Trent Woodlands last week which consolidated our learning as we foraged for food and built shelters. This term we have learnt so much about how early humans survived and developed! We made Stonehenge and



Iron Hill Fort models in Design and Technology using PlayDough, Stone Age necklaces and even a Stone Age stew. Last week we brought all our learning together, creating our own Stone Age board games which we greatly enjoyed making and playing!

In English, we wrote non-chronological reports about the Stone Age including text features such as an introduction, sub-headings and factual paragraphs. We also learnt to write a fictional problem story based around the book 'The Stone Age Boy'.

In Maths, we developed our mental and written calculation skills for addition and subtraction, learning all about the column method. As part of our money topic, we learnt to recognise and use pounds and pence, combining amounts to make a particular value and finding different combinations of coins that make the same amount of money. Please continue to support your child's understanding of money over the



holidays as we will briefly continue this topic in the new year. Additionally, next half term we will be introduced to Mathletics (an interactive website) as part of our school and home learning.

In Science, we learnt about humans focusing in particular on the basic needs, learning about the five food groups and why it is important to have a varied and balanced diet. Thank you for all your support. I have enjoyed getting to know the children this term and am looking forward to the next half term!
